Study Time:

Psalm 134 (New King James Version)

1 Behold, bless the Lord,
All you servants of the Lord,
Who by night stand in the house of the Lord!

2 Lift up your hands in the sanctuary,
And bless the Lord.

3 The Lord who made heaven and earth
Bless you from Zion!

Psalm 134 (The Message)

1-3 Come, bless God,

Discussion Time:

1. On Sunday, Rudy outlined three ways that we are called to by God to bless him; through praise, worship, and prayer.

Here are examples of the difference between praise & worship:

Praising God: "Thank you, you're wonderful"

Worshipping God: "I love you LORD, magnify your name here in this place and in my life"

Discuss together how we can praise and how we can worship God in our daily life? How does this ultimately affect our relationship with Him?

- 2. There are benefits to praising God. Psalm 103:2 says: "Bless the LORD O my soul, and forget not all his benefits". Take a few moments to discuss what some of those benefits might be. Here are some examples:
 - 1. The Lord takes pleasure in you, when you praise God. (Zephaniah 3:17: "[The Lord] will exult over you with loud singing")
 - 2. God will give you peace, rest, and authority in troubling circumstances.
 - 3. Praising God is contagious to those around us.
- 3. We believe that two tools that God has given us as weapons against principalities and powers are prayer and worship. Reflect on Revelation 4:1-11, and 8:4. There we see the throne room, where God is being worshipped, and our prayers in his presence. How does this change your outlook on your prayer and worship life?
- 3. Rudy gave us a challenge to practice praising God. It can be easier to cry out to God on a Sunday morning, but it's not always in our nature to cry out to God in worship throughout the week. How can you practice praising God this week?
- 4. A French strategist, Ferdinand Foch said: "The most powerful weapon on earth is a human soul on fire." Do you believe this? How can our worship to God change the community around us and should it?
